On another note, we have begun getting things together for the annual fashion show. There are committee chairs this year for the various tasks and they will be the focal point for their assigned area. We have met and made some initial decisions. For example, the enduring title for our future fashion shows will be 'Runway for Love.' The theme for 2025 is 'Helping Children Soar.' The 2025 show will be at Laurel Oak Country Club again since they are generously giving us the same pricing. That allows us to keep the tickets at \$55. Last year's goals were 250 people and a profit of \$5000. We sold 175 tickets and netted \$7500. We earmarked less than 2% of that for our operating expenses. The rest went to directly support Shriners Childrens. This year the goal is still 250 people but a profit goal of \$10,000. It is going to take all of us to reach that goal. We need you to sell tickets, to get out and obtain sponsorships and to collect high end items for the 'opportunities to own' events at the fashion show. My wish for our court is to raise expectations for ourselves and our court; to deepen our efforts at meaningful support for the children and our other interests in the community.
